Notes:

A serious claim is an accepted workers' compensation claim that involves one or more weeks away from work and excludes all fatalities, and all injuries and diseases experienced while travelling to or from work or while on a break away from the workplace. Time lost and amounts of compensation are not reported for the preliminary year (2015–16) because serious claims for that period are likely to be open and claimants may accrue more time off work and compensation in subsequent years. Median amounts of compensation are rounded to the nearest 100.

The claim numbers are rounded to the nearest 5 to maintain confidentiality. Therefore, the sum of claims may not be equal to the reported totals.
